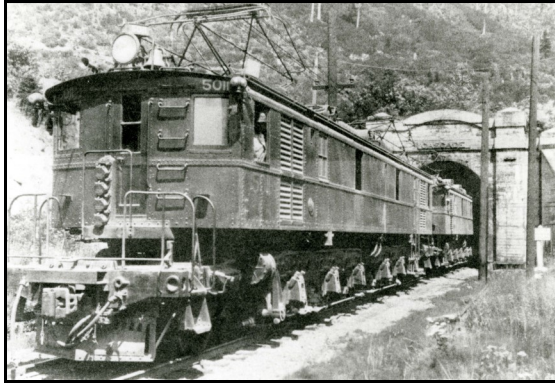

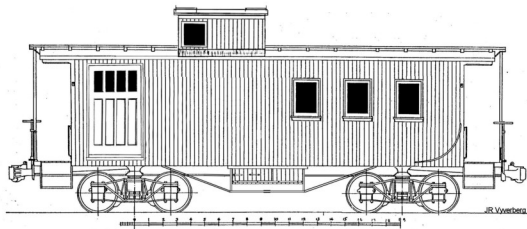

The St. Paul office is located in the Minnesota Transportation Museum at the Jackson Street Roundhouse and consists of 6500 square feet of storage.

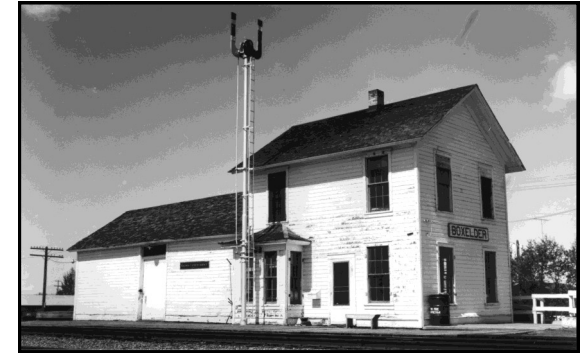
The Seattle office is located at the Pacific Northwest Railroad Archives, as part of their 7500 square foot facility, in Burien, Washington.
